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### Dot Medical Examination Guidelines

A Department of Transportation (DOT) physical examination must be conducted by a licensed "medical examiner" listed on the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration (FMCSA) National Registry. The term includes, but is not limited to, doctors of medicine (MD), doctors of osteopathy (DO), physician assistants (PA), advanced practice nurses (APN), and doctors of chiropractic (DC).

Each time you turn the key, you are responsible for your own safety, as well as the safety of all the people who share the road with you. The physical examination you take for your medical certificate confirms that you are healthy enough to safely perform the demanding job of a CMV driver and ...

### **Driver Medical Fitness for Duty - [fmcsa.dot.gov](http://fmcsa.dot.gov)**

Drivers will be required to certify that the information they give is accurate and true, and that false or missing information may, and probably will, invalidate their Medical Certificate. Drivers can look over the Official Medical Examination Report 649-F (6045) that your Medical Examiner will fill out and transmit to the DOT after your physical.

The Department of Transportation (DOT) examination is an essential part of assuring a healthy CMV driver workforce. The guidelines assist medical examiners in the evaluation and certification of each person on whom they perform a DOT examination. The last DOT review of its cardiac guidelines for CMV drivers was published in December 1987.

About the Medical Examination Report (MER) Form, MCSA-5875The Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration requires that interstate commercial motor vehicle drivers maintain a current Medical Examiner's Certificate (MEC), Form MCSA-5876 to drive. As part of the physical, drivers are required to fill out the medical history portion of the Medical Examination Report (MER) Form, MCSA-5875.

### **Medical Examination Report (MER) Form, MCSA-5875 | FMCSA**

Stage 2 - BP 160-179/100-109 Certification Period 3 months as one time certification. Within the 3 months, if the blood pressure is below 140/90, the driver may receive 1 year certification. Stage 3 - BP Reading >180/110 Disqualified. When the blood pressure is less than 140/90, the driver can be certified at 6 month intervals.

DOT MEDICAL GUIDELINES -DIABETES The Department of Transportation (DOT) Medical Examination is very highly regulated as illness complications can have serious consequences for the driver, the examiner, and the general public. DOT medical guidelines outline the health criteria that commercial vehicle drivers must meet to qualify for certification.

The driver will also be required to present a medical examiners certificate and pay the applicable transaction fee. Additional information on Department of Transportation medical requirements may be found in the commercial federal regulations.

## **TxDPS - Commercial Driver License (CDL) Medical ...**

Hearing. General physical exam. A DOT physical can cover up to twelve different categories of wellness, ranging from neurological to vascular. The driver may be asked to bring past medical records, and even correctional devices such as eye glasses, contacts or hearing aids to their DOT physical.

### **CDL DOT Medical | Department of Revenue - Motor Vehicle**

At your DOT physical exam, you'll be required to disclose your complete medical history, including past and recent surgeries, medications you're currently taking, ongoing medical conditions, and any history of substance abuse.

### **DOT Physical Exam Requirements & What to Expect | TDI**

If your USDOT Medical Examiner's Certificate indicates "must be accompanied by a Diabetic, Hearing, Seizure or Vision waiver exemption or an SPE Certificate," you must have a Medical Variance issued by FMCSA.

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
